- 3. Launch event on Triangle (Cake/Collect/Construct)
- 4. Suggest pictures of boxes in bloom posted on our Facebook page.

- Consider NARA providing some boxes on a 1st come 1st served basis (posssibly approach garden centres for discount or 10% discount vouchers), RJ investigate costs.
- 7. Investigate grant possibilities
