Preparations have already begun and work by the artist, Rhys Cowe, will be completed in the spring. In addition to the refurbishment, five new boxes, which have appeared since 2014, will also be brought up to the same standard. Planting

The planting is not yet complete but with the help of a very generous anonymous donation, autumn and spring planting will continue.
