Who are we?

NARA has been set up by residents of Ewlyn Road, Hermitage Street, Francis Street, Exmouth Street, Langdon Road, Clare Place, Naunton Parade, Naunton Terrace and Naunton Crescent.

We want to help develop a better sense of community, deal with concerns affecting our area – from planning applications to rough sleepers – and give the community a greater voice than we would have as individuals. NARA's first year

Since being formed in November 2016, NARA has been working to promote the local community and improve the environment of our neighbourhood.

One of our main projects has been adopting The Triangle – a neglected space on the corner of Hermitage Street and Francis Street – to transform it into a 'pocket garden'. We held 'Cake and Consultation' events to get local people involved in the design, and successfully applied for grants from Community Pride and the Midcounties Co-operative Communities Fund to fund the work.

Work started in December, when 27 intrepid volunteers tackled snow, sleepers and a lot of topsoil over three days. Three new raised beds were built and over 1000 daffodil bulbs were planted by local residents and children on New Year's Day.

The next phase is to plant the site as a Cottage Garden. We will be building an additional planter for the corner of the garden – visit our website to see the designs and vote for your favourite. We will also be supplying seeds to anyone who would like to grow flowers for planting in summer – if you would like to take part please email derekscarb@hotmail.com

We've also met with the council to discuss begging in the Bath Road, organised litter picks (see overleaf) and drains/gulleys being cleared, kept people informed about and responded to planning applications, ensured new road markings did not impact on parking, and identified trees for removal and replacement.

Thanks to the Bath Road businesses who have donated to help our projects and to all the members who have joined and volunteered so far – we hope to see even more of you in 2018!
