## Successful defibrillator JustGiving campaign

NARA, in conjunction with SPJARA and Cheltenham Connect, has ensured that the life-saving defibrillator outside The Exmouth Arms will continue to improve cardiac arrest survival rates for anyone in the vicinity.

Each year thousands of people are resuscitated outside of hospital. For every minute that someone is in cardiac arrest without receiving CPR and having a defibrillator used on them, their chance of survival decreases by 10%.

Within two weeks of the campaign being launched, the £1,200 target was achieved. The money raised will enable the South West Ambulance Trust (SWAST) to maintain the device and provide FREE training courses for the next four years.
